This weekend we feature the second of our saints in the mosaic background for the Shrine of the Good Shepherd - St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta. We chose her first and foremost for her outstanding example of charity toward those most in need, and also because she was canonized during our renovation.

Last week we heard from the Gospel of Matthew the parable of the sower, where Jesus spoke about four kinds of grounds and one of them was "on rich soil and produced fruit, a hundred, sixty, or thirtyfold."

This ground is still producing many fruits for the sake of the kingdom of God. These fruits are the many consecrated men and women who have offered their lives to serve those who are in need. Many of these consecrated men and women have become saints for our Catholic Church like **St. Teresa of Calcutta** whose image is here at St. Vincent Martyr church. Let me share some remarkable things from this great saint.

Her name was **Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu**; she was born on August 26, 1910. She came from a religious family. She spent her adolescence by being involved in a Jesuit parish working with the youth. She received her first communion at the age of five and a year later was confirmed.

Eighteen years later, Agnes left home to enter into a convent in Dublin, Ireland where she was admitted as a postulate and received the name of Teresa after her patroness, St. Therese of Lisieux.

In 1929, after spending a year in the convent, she was sent to India. In 1946 going to her annual retreat she received an inspiration which she named "her call within a call." From that inspiration, by reflecting on Jesus' thirst for love and for souls, she was allowed to begin the Missionaries of Charity family of sisters, brothers, fathers, and co-workers.

The congregation grew up quickly throughout the world. Teresa set up houses for prostitutes, battered women, orphanages for poor children and houses for those suffering from AIDS. She was a defender of the unborn; she always said: "if you hear of some woman who does not want to keep her child and wants to have an abortion, try to persuade her to bring him to me. I will love that child, seeing in him the sign of God's love."

Teresa died on September 5, 1997, was beatified on October 19, 2003 by Pope St. John Paul II. On her beatification St. John Paul II said: "Teresa is a woman of unshakable faith," he added, her story is a story of biblical faith. She was canonized on September 4, 2016 by Pope Francis.

We are blessed having her image on our outdoor shrine mosaic. May we, through her intercession, become defenders of the unborn and help those who are in need.

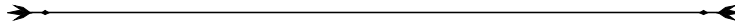

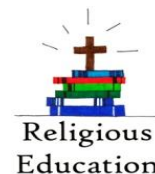

Ordinario**

Primera Lectura: Is. 55, 10-11

Créanme, parece decirnos el Señor, a través del profeta Isaías. Mi palabra es eficaz. Evangelio: San Mateo 31, 1-23

Las parábolas en labios de Jesús son comparaciones o imágenes destinadas a ilustrar una idea o enseñanza, en concreto sobre el reino de Dios. Contienen "los secretos del reino de Dios", según la respuesta de Cristo a sus discípulos, que san Mateo nos presenta en el Evangelio de hoy.
