Registering for Religious Education in the academic year 2015-2016

Remember space sometimes can be limited in certain programming so we urge you to return your completed paperwork in a timely fashion.

If you have a child in preschool, please contact us to learn more about the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program. If your child has special needs, we also can share with you about our God's Rainbow program. One great way to evangelize and spread the word about the love of Jesus is to invite others to come to know Him.

Primera Lectura: Ezequiel 17, 22-24

Esto dice el Señor Dios: “Yo tomaré un renuevo de la copa de un gran cedro, de su más alta rama cortaré un retoño. Lo plantaré en la cima de un monte excelso y sublime. Lo plantaré en la montaña más alta de Israel. Echaré ramas, dará fruto y se convertirá en un cedro magnífico. En él anidarán toda clase de pájaros y descansarán al abrigo de sus ramas. Así, todos los árboles del campo sabrán que yo, el

Señor, humillo los árboles altos y elevo los árboles pequeños; que seco los árboles lozanos y hago florecer los árboles secos. Yo, el Señor, lo he dicho y lo haré”.

Segunda Lectura: 2Cor. 5, 6-10:

Hermanos: Siempre tenemos confianza, aunque sabemos que, mientras vivimos en el cuerpo, estamos desterrados, lejos del Señor. Caminamos guiados por la fe, sin ver todavía. Estamos, pues, llenos de confianza y preferimos salir de este cuerpo para vivir con el Señor. Por eso procuramos agradarle, en el destierro o en la patria. Porque todos tendremos que comparecer ante el tribunal de Cristo, para recibir el premio o el castigo por lo que hayamos hecho en esta vida.

Evangelio San Marcos 4, 26-24

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a la multitud: “El Reino de Dios se parece a lo que sucede cuando un hombre siembra la semilla en la tierra: que pasan las noches y los días, y sin que él sepa cómo, la semilla germina y crece; y la tierra, por sí sola, va produciendo el fruto: primero los tallos, luego las espigas y después los granos en las espigas. Y cuando ya están maduros los granos, el hombre echa mano de la hoz, pues ha llegado el tiempo de la cosecha”.

Les dijo también: “¿Con qué compararemos el Reino de Dios? ¿Con qué parábola lo podremos representar? Es como una semilla de mostaza que, cuando se siembra, es la más pequeña de las semillas; pero una vez sembrada, crece y se convierte en el mayor de los arbustos y echa ramas tan grandes, que los pájaros pueden anidar a su sombra”.

Y con otras muchas parábolas semejantes les estuvo exponiendo su mensaje, de acuerdo con lo que ellos podían entender. Y no les hablaba sino en parábolas; pero a sus discípulos

Evangelii Gaudium

(Las alegrías del Evangelio) papa Francisco

Hace dos años, 2013, el Papa Francisco publicó una exhortación apostólica llamada Evangelii Gaudium, las alegrías del Evangelio. Como comunidad hispana de la parroquia San Vicente Mártir, leeremos dos veces al mes un poco de este documento del papa para conocer acerca de la Iglesia y sus escritos.



Capítulo segundo

En la crisis del compromiso comunitario

50. Antes de hablar acerca de algunas cuestiones fundamentales relacionadas con la acción evangelizadora, conviene recordar brevemente cuál es el contexto en el cual nos toca vivir y actuar. Hoy suele hablarse de un «exceso de diagnóstico» que no siempre está acompañado de propuestas superadoras y realmente aplicables. Por otra parte, tampoco nos serviría una mirada puramente sociológica, que podría tener pretensiones de abarcar toda la realidad con su metodología de una manera supuestamente neutra y aséptica. Lo que quiero ofrecer va más bien en la línea de un discernimiento evangélico. Es la mirada del discípulo misionero, que se «alimenta a la luz y con la fuerza del Espíritu Santo».53

51. No es función del Papa ofrecer un análisis detallado y completo sobre la realidad contemporánea, pero aliento a todas las comunidades a una «siempre vigilante capacidad de estudiar los signos de los tiempos».54 Se trata de una responsabilidad grave, ya que algunas realidades del presente, si no son bien resueltas, pueden desencadenar procesos de deshumanización difíciles de revertir más adelante. Es preciso esclarecer aquello que pueda ser un fruto del Reino y también aquello que atenta contra el proyecto de Dios. Esto implica no sólo reconocer e interpretar las mociones del buen espíritu y del malo, sino –y aquí radica lo decisivo– elegir las del buen espíritu y rechazar las del malo. Doy por supuestos los diversos análisis que ofrecieron otros documentos del Magisterio universal, así como los que han propuesto los episcopados regionales y nacionales. En esta Exhortación sólo pretendo detenerme brevemente, con una mirada pastoral, en algunos aspectos de la realidad que pueden detener o debilitar los dinamismos de renovación misionera de la Iglesia, sea porque afectan a la vida y a la dignidad del Pueblo de Dios, sea porque inciden también en los sujetos que participan de un modo más directo en las instituciones eclesiales y en tareas evangelizadoras.
