MERCIFUL LIKE THE FATHER

WHAT IS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE HOLY DOOR DURING A JUBILEE YEAR?



A Holy door symbolizes a passage or transition into a special year of evangelization and prayer. Pope Francis declared the Jubilee Year of Mercy at the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica and will be back at the door December 8 to formally open it and the Year of Mercy.

Popes typically announce a jubilee every 25 years, although extraordinary Holy Years have been proclaimed for special anniversaries — for example, a Holy Year was celebrated in 1983 to commemorate the 1,950th anniversary of Christ's death and resurrection. The Holy Door is opened to evoke the concept of forgiveness, which is the main focus of a Holy Year.

According to "Mondo Vaticano," a mini-encyclopedia published by the Vatican, the designation of a Holy Door may trace back to the ancient Christian practice of public penitence when sinners were given public penances to perform before receiving absolution. The penitents were not allowed to enter a church before completing the penance, but they were solemnly welcomed back in when their penance was fulfilled. Still today, Holy Year pilgrims enter the basilica through the Holy Door as a sign of their repentance and re-commitment to a life of faith. Both the opening and closing of the Holy Door take place with formal ceremonies

to mark "the period of time set aside for men and women to sanctify their souls," the book says.

The ritual for opening the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica goes back to 1499 when Pope Alexander VI opened the door on Christmas Eve to inaugurate the Holy Year 1500. This was when the door was wooden. The bronze door panels that stand at St. Peter's today, made by Vico Consorti, were consecrated and first opened December 24, 1949, by Pius XII in proclamation of the 1950 Jubilee, a scene represented in the bottom right panel. For centuries, the doors were opened with a silver hammer, not a key, "because the doors of justice and mercy give way only to the force of prayer and penance," the encyclopedia says. Opening the Holy Year 2000, St. John Paul used neither a hammer, nor a key, but strongly pushed the door open.

The theme of human sin and God's mercy is illustrated in 15 of the 16 bronze panels that make up the current door, with episodes from both the Old and New Testament, including the Fall of Adam and Eve, the Annunciation, and the Merciful Father (and Prodigal Son).

Between the panels on the door at St. Peter's are little shields with the coats of arms of all the popes that opened it during the ordinary Holy Years, the last being St. John Paul. Pope Francis' coat of arms will be etched onto one of the empty shields that remain for future jubilee years after he opens and closes the door.

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: I Kings 19:4-8

Queen Jezebel had vowed to kill Elijah, who went into the desert and prayed for death. Instead he went to sleep and was awakened by an angel, who told him to eat the food God had given him. 

Primera Lectura: 1 Reyes 19:4-8

UNA FRESCA PERSPECTIVA DE LAS LECTURAS DOMINICALES SU PALABRA HOY

Décimo Noveno Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario de agosto de 2015

“No entristezcan al Espíritu Santo de Dios, que los ha marcado con un sello para el día de la redención. Eviten la amargura, los arrebatos, la ira, los gritos, los insultos y toda clase de maldad. Por el contrario, sean mutuamente buenos y compasivos, perdonándose los unos a los otros como Dios los ha perdonado en Cristo.”

Cuando San Pablo les escribió a los efesios, incluyó una lista de lo que necesitamos y de lo que debemos eliminar de nuestras vidas. Es fácil recordarla. Estas son virtudes que buscamos y seguramente manifestamos en muchas formas. Pasamos por alto los defectos, y quizá no los vemos como barreras u obstáculos cuando consideramos recibir la Eucaristía.

San Pablo no se refiere a simples molestias, como el calor o una tormenta, sino los serios vicios dirigidos a otras personas. Ofrezcamos un remedio: Primero oremos por la persona o personas contra las que sentimos rabia, furia o enojo. Segundo, cuando se nos dificulta ‘perdonar y olvidar’, recuerde, pero sin amargura. Los vicios nos hacen menos humanos, menos amoros, egoistas, menos dignos de ser amados.

El Señor nos habla así como habló a Elías: ‘¡Levántate, come, porque todavía te queda mucho por caminar!’
