CHILDREN'S COLLECTION


Our children's collection for Catholic Extension for the weekend of July 2/3 amounted to \$35.00. Thank you girls and boys for helping.

HOW CAN WE BECOME BETTER STEWARDS OF CREATION?

As we celebrate the 1 year anniversary of the Holy Father's Encyclical, *Laudato Si*, we have come to realize this letter gives new clarity to our mission as Christians. We are to care for our common home. For Pope Francis, "mission" is a critical word. *Evangelii Gaudium, the Joy of the Gospel*, was all about mission.



In their 1992 pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, the U.S. Bishops explained: An *oikonomos* or *steward* is one to whom the owner of a household turns over responsibility for caring for the property, managing affairs, making resources yield as much as possible, and sharing the resources with others. The position involves trust and accountability. (19)

Pope Francis calls us to be aware of our role as steward and to be grounded in the care of creation, to be "collaborators in creation" (26). *Laudato Si* is a reflection on our discipleship as stewards. **Stewardship is a spirituality that aims for a growth in holiness.** We cannot be good Christian stewards without taking care of "our common home. The respect and care for creation which God has entrusted to us helps each Christian live out his or her call to holiness.

During the summer months, many of us spend more time out of doors and certainly we are aware of the beauty of creation which surrounds us. Our time spent swimming, fishing, hiking, camping, boating, etc. during these summer months, brings us the opportunity to focus on the gifts with which we are blessed.

How can you and your family become better stewards this summer of all that has been entrusted to you?

Our summer schedule has begun and will extend through the weekend of August 27/28. The Eucharist will be celebrated on Saturday at 5:00 pm and 7:00 pm, (Spanish) and on Sunday at 7:15, 9:15 and 11:15 am. All masses will be celebrated in the gym - St. Vincent Martyr Lower Church.

The 12:00 p.m. daily Mass will not be celebrated from Monday, July 4 through Monday, September 5. The 8:30 a.m. daily masses will continue to be celebrated at Saint Paul Inside the Wall.

SUNDAY READINGS

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses petitions the people to follow the commandments God has set before them. He reminds them that the laws are not in the sky or far away at sea, but are accessible to them and meant to be followed if they wish to prosper.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Paul discusses the divine nature of Jesus, and explains that Jesus was created before anything else. Everything else was "created through him, and for him."

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

While discussing everlasting life, a lawyer mentions loving one's neighbor as oneself. The lawyer then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells him about a man beaten by robbers, who was ignored by both a priest and a Levite before a Samaritan stopped and offered him aid. Jesus asks the lawyer who was neighbor to the injured man. The lawyer says "the one who treated him with compassion." Jesus encourages him to go and do the same.





“La parábola del hombre malherido por los ladrones camino de Jericó es toda una catequesis muy fuerte, muy radical, de Jesús de Nazaret contra la religión oficial judía. Los “malos”, los que no atienden al moribundo, son dos miembros de la élite religiosa de Israel. Quien recoge al herido, le lleva a la posada y da dinero para que el posadero le cuide es un hereje, un samaritano, un
