HOW CAN WE BECOME BETTER DISCIPLES?
BE PEOPLE OF HOSPITALITY

Our Gospel Reading this weekend from Luke is all about hospitality. It is clear in this Gospel that there are two kinds of hospitality. There is the hospitality of Martha, the one who makes sure the Lord and His followers are welcomed, comforted, and provided with all the elements of good service. But Jesus also wants Martha (and us) to know that there is another other side of hospitality, that of Mary, welcoming Jesus and His teachings into our life. One of the surest ways to spread the love of Jesus Christ in our world is to be agents of hospitality, both like Martha and Mary. One of the easiest places to begin practicing that mindset is to be welcoming at Church.

How can I be more welcoming?

1. Cultivate the virtue of hospitality at Mass.

Make hospitality a new habit when you go to Mass.

2. Come early, leave late.

Instead of rushing to mass to be there on time, and then rushing out at its conclusion, make time to come a little early and linger just a bit later. Make room in your busy life to greet and spend time with others at mass.

3. Go in peace to greet someone!

Seek out someone you've not met before. Shake their hand, introduce yourself, and take a few moments to welcome them to your parish home, God's house.

4. Welcome everyone.

Not only do visitors need your warm welcome, regular mass attendees also need a friendly greeting. You are greeting others in the name of Christ.

5. Help newcomers connect.

While you are getting to know visitors, introduce them to other parishioners as the opportunity presents itself.

6. Say goodbye with genuine warmth.

After mass, bid farewell to visitors, inviting them to return next week. Introduce them to Fr. George and Fr. Darwin if the opportunity arises.

7. Give visitors information about the parish.

Ensure that a visitor has a bulletin and other information about the parish before they leave.

SUNDAY READINGS

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham, who saw three men standing near his tent. Sensing they were messengers, he hurriedly brought them food and water to refresh themselves. Upon leaving, the men told him that they would visit in a year, at which time his childless wife Sarah would have a son.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul discusses the suffering Christ endured for his Church. He describes his willingness to also endure suffering in Jesus' name. Paul hopes that through his sacrifices, many people will become complete in Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

Jesus was welcomed into the home of a woman named Martha. She complained to Jesus that her sister Mary sat listening to him instead of helping with the tasks of entertaining. Jesus told Martha that her sister had chosen the more important task, and should be allowed to listen.



“La bella escena de Marta y María, en Betania, y según nos relata el Evangelio de San Lucas, la hemos tomado como propia y la web Betania la considera

como una fiestas, como un aniversario, casi como una onomástica. Nosotros afirmamos que este Domingo XVI del Tiempo Ordinario el Domingo de Betania y que Marta y María son nuestras patronas.
