The Pastor's Corner

Last week I asked our good friend, Bishop Rodimer, if he would consider writing an article for our bulletin on Blessed Oscar Romero who is honored in a stained glass window in the north sacristy. He graciously agreed. After you read this powerful reflection I am sure you will understand why Blessed Oscar was chosen to serve as an inspiration to the priests and bishops and deacons who will vest for Mass in that sacristy.

Blessed Oscar Romero

"If you don't have the courage to speak up for the rights of the poor, you don't have the right to speak up for God."

Those powerful and challenging words of Father Luis Espinal, S.J., inspired Archbishop Oscar Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador, often called the "Voice of the Voiceless" in his country. The Archbishop was assassinated while saying Mass in the chapel of the Hospital Divina Providentia on March 24, 1980. He had just finished his homily and was moving over a few steps to the altar. The assassin was a soldier or a professional - he took but one shot. He shot from the front of the chapel and successfully escaped.

I had the privilege of being the principal celebrant of Holy Mass at the altar of that chapel with a group of American priests for a two country pilgrimage to Guatemala and El Salvador in January 2009. We went to experience the story of missionaries and children of thousands of indigenous people who suffered, died or "disappeared" through oppression, torture and deprivation of their most basic human rights. They went through two decades of what has been declared a genocide. The vast majority of the victims were Mayan descendants.

Oscar Romero was born August 15, 1917, ordained a priest in 1942 and a bishop in 1974. He was considered a conservative when appointed Archbishop of El Salvador in 1977 - no trouble to the elite, they thought! But just three weeks after his appointment, his good friend Father Rutilio Grande, together with two other men were killed by a death squad.

Father Rutilio had been vocal, practical and persistent in support of sugar cane workers. He was a thorn in the side of the government and the landowners - 2% of them owned 60% of the land in El Salvador.

Archbishop Romero was never the same. He said after Mass at the site of Father Rutilio's murder, "When I looked at Rutilio lying there dead, I thought: if they killed him for doing what he did, then I too have to walk the same path." He cancelled all Masses for the following Sunday, but for a single Mass at the Cathedral where he proclaimed in his homily, "anyone who lays hands on one of my priests, lays hands on me." From then on, his fate was sealed and he embraced it.

Archbishop Oscar Romero was declared a martyr and beatified by Pope Francis on May 23, 2015. He is venerated in Saint Vincent Martyr's newly decorated church sacristy by a beautiful stained glass window.

Archbishop Romero had a good idea of what he was in for; he once said "If I am killed, I shall rise in the Salvadoran people." Not only in them, I dare say, but in all people who have respect for the human person created in the image and likeness of God.
